	Oriented to the west, this duplex rests on a tan-painted concrete foundation. Tan stucco clads the exterior walls. Windows ar 1-beside-1-light, sliding sash, with aluminum frames. Fiberglass awnings shelter those windows opening in the front (west) façade. A pair of doorways opens in either half of the symmetrical façade. They host wood slab doors, opening behind white vinyl-frame storm doors. Approaching the doorways are concrete steps. Doorways also open in both halves of the rear (east) elevation. They have 1-light, 4-panel wood doors, painted blue-green, opening behind aluminum-frame storm doors. Approaching them are concrete stoops. Brown, interlocking asphalt shingles cover the side-gabled roof, and the tan-painted wood fascia and soffit box the eaves.

This property is located on terrain sloping downward from northeast to southwest, with an elevation of around 4,700 feet above mean sea level. The neighborhood features modest and large, 1- and 2-story houses and apartment buildings. Setbacks from Craig Street are generally the same on this block. This property is situated on the southeast corner of Craig and West 18th streets. Gravel covers the entire property. Encircling the back yard is a decorative, concrete-block wall.

42. Statement of significance:

Because this property is less than 50 years old and does not meet any of criteria considerations A through G, it is ineligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Moreover, the architectural and historical significance are not to the extent that the property would qualify for individual listing in the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties or as a City of Pueblo landmark. Given its age, the property should not be considered a contributing resource within any potential historic district.

43. Assessment of historic physical integrity related to significance:

Constructed in 1965, this duplex exhibits a high level of physical integrity relative to the seven aspects of integrity as defined by the National Park Service and the Colorado Historical Society: location, setting, design, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association. It has not been notably altered since its construction. This property retains sufficient physical integrity to convey its architectural and historical significance.

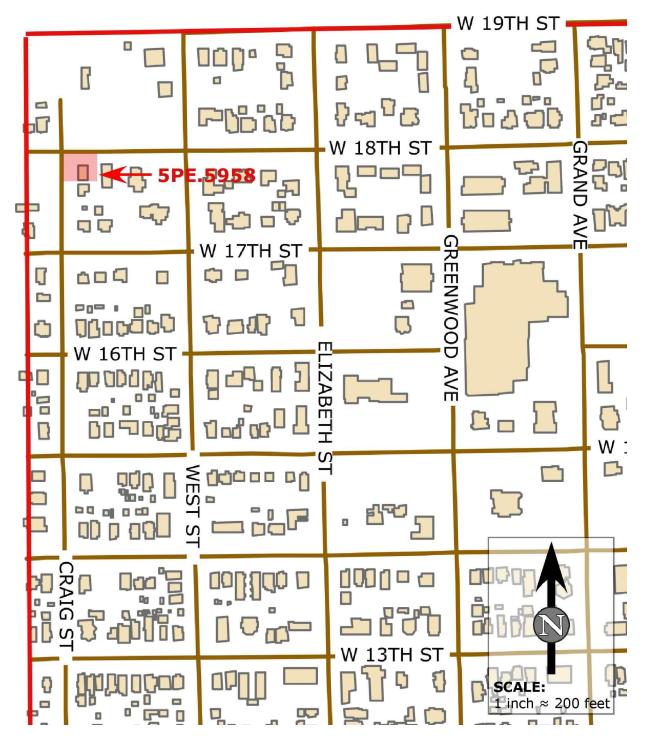

SITE SKETCH MAP



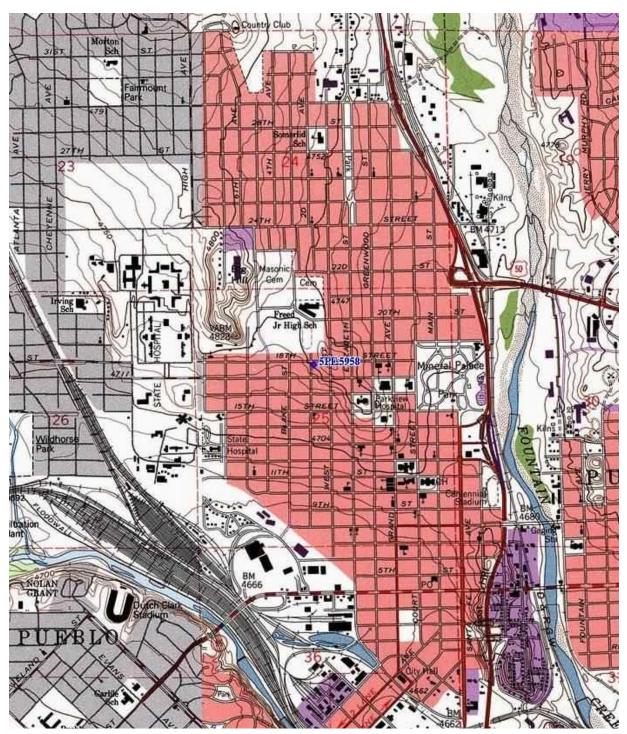
